

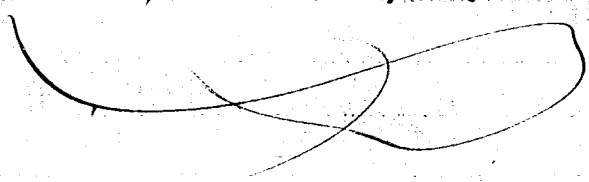

William Madison of King & Queen County,
Virginia, do make this my last will
and testament as follows to wit:
I direct, first of all, that all my just
debts be paid and subject thereto, with
the exception of a debt to my son
disposed of. I leave my estate
both real and personal to my wife & son
Madison, during her entire life, & the
same, at her death, or upon her death
may if she shall marry again & be
equally divided among all my children
but should either of my daughters die
without leaving issue, I direct that
the share of my daughter so dying, shall
upon the death of such daughter so
pass to my other children & be equally
divided among them. I give my son
Joseph my little cot-narrated Can.
I direct that there shall be no sale of
my personal property unless a sale
of the same shall be required for
the payment of my debts, in which
case, I wish only such articles to be
sold, as can be most conveniently
disposed from the use of my wife;
it being my wish, as far as may
be practicable, that my property shall
be kept together. Lastly, I appoint
friend W. H. Haynes my Executor,
And that no security be required
of him, by the Court, a public & y.
creation, witness my hand & seal
this 20th day of April 1882

In King Leon County Court August 3 1882,
This last will & testament of William
Madison Clark was produced in Court by
C. M. Haynes the executor named
and was proven by the oaths of C. M. Squibb
and W. D. Wright the subscribing witnesses
Hunts, and edwards & presented and in
the motion of the said C. M. Haynes the
executor named was made out.
Hunts, entered into and acknowledged
about in the sum of Eight hundred
dollars (\$800) and delivered to the said
Clark (without security) the estate having
refused in his will that no
security be required of his said executor.
Certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probate of said will in due form.
