and testament,

1<sup>st</sup> My will and desire is that all my just debts be paid  
2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my two sons Doctor John & William Lewis  
to be equally divided between them my stock of medi-  
cal and office fixtures, together with my medical  
library.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my wife M. L. A. M. St. H. G. Lewis  
whole of my Estate both real and personal, with  
full and full powers to sell, change, or make a  
disposition of the same, which she may think most  
advantageous, to raise and educate my three young  
children Ann Churchill, Granville Revere, and Mrs.  
Rosalie Lewis, to hold the same for and during  
her natural life, at her death to be equally  
divided between the survivors of the said three  
children Ann Churchill, Granville Revere & Mrs.  
Rosalie Lewis, to them and their heirs forever.

I appoint and constitute my said wife Executor  
to this my last will and Testament, and do  
that she may not be required to give account  
in Court for the performance of the same.
