I Zachary Lewis, knowing the uncertainty of human life, do make this my last will and testament,

1st My will and desire is that all my just debts be paid
2nd I give to my two sons Doctrs. John & William Lewis to be equally divided between them my stock of money real and office fixtures, together with my medical library.

3^d I give to my wife M. L. A. M. S^t. Dst. G. Lewis whole of my Estate both real and personal, with full and full powers to sell, charge, or make any disposition of the same, which she may think most advantageous, to raise and educate my three children Ann Churchill, Granville Revere, and Rosalie Lewis, to hold the same for and during her natural life, at her death to be equally divided between the survivors of the said children Ann Churchill, Granville Revere & Rosalie Lewis, to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint and constitute my said wife to this my last will and testament, and do declare that she may not be required to give security in Court for the performance of the same.

Witness my hand & seal this 10th day of September 1841.
