Brand the sum of one hundred twenty five dollars forty eight cents on the ninth day of January 1813, the further sum of One thousand two hundred four dollars fifty six cents on the twentieth day of January 1813 on account of the within debt of trust. In consideration whereof, and whereas the said Oliver K. Brand has made of property in the within deed together with property on a part of a plantation late belonging to the said Oliver K. Brand to the same lessees for my benefit, to whom also the payment of taxes now due from the said lessor to me without the within mentioned lessor having been less than two half acres of land, being the corner of claye William Estate of 169th acres in the said plantation resided, and whereas the said lessor has for the same 169th acres of land to the said Pollard; We do therefore hereby relinquish and release from all right, title or interest in and to the said 169th acres of land on which the above mentioned debt is due, so that the within Test is never to operate or have any effect as it relates to any of 169th acres of land as is herein particularly described from Dilneys Estate to be paid, but it is hereby understood that this relinquishment is not to affect our right and interest under the within Test as it relates to the other tracts of land therein mentioned, nor any right, interest or remedy under the deed above mentioned of a plantation late belonging to the within Test. Given under our hands this the 8th March 1813.

This Deed witness made this 9th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, Between Fleming Mitchell of the one part and Oliver K. Brand of the other part both of the County of King William. Witness in consideration of the sum of ten thousand three hundred dollars and the receipt whereof he left hereby acknowledged and agreed and by these present doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Oliver K. Brand the land out plantation late belonging to the said Fleming Mitchell now residing and lately removed, which land late plantation of Fleming Mitchell lies by lot bearing date first of February One thousand seven hundred and eleven, One acre and a half bearing date 21st October 1810 of the County of King William, and containing according to survey and metes bounds and corners.
