made this 30th day of March One thousand Eight hundred
between Warner L. Mennely of King William County of the first part, James
Fox of the same County of the second part, and John Fry also of the same County of the third part,
Whereas the said James Fox stands bound as security for the said Warner L. Mennely
second bond, one to J. Whitlaw dated 13th January 1809 payable on the first day of
1811, for the sum of One thousand One hundred and thirty two dollars, the other
Henry Earnett for the sum of One thousand six hundred and thirty dollars or rather
payable the first day of January 1812, and he the said James Fox holds the said bond
for the sum of Three hundred thirty pounds payable the first day of January
for corn purchases of him. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Warner L.
for and in consideration of securing the said James Fox in the said security aforesaid, and
pay to him the true & punctual payment of the said bond for three hundred & thirty
above stated, and further for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand
by the said John Fry to the said Warner L. Mennely the receipt whereof he doth
acknowledge, have bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents, do bargain, sell
unto the said John Fry, the following property, to wit: first the following slave
Benson, Jerry, Joe, Ned, Parvata, Betty & child and the future increase of the said
Parvata, two riding Horses, 2 Carriage Horses, One Carriage Harness, one riding
Mule, 3 Plow Horses, one brood mare in foal, two Goats, Decently my farming
with the Stocks of Hogs, cattle & sheep according to the annexed Schedule, and
my household & kitchen furniture, contained also in the annexed Schedule, To
hold the said property herby conveyed unto him the said John Fry his heirs
& assigns for ever in free absolute and unconditional fee simple to him and then
and his heirs, upon trust, to the following, uses purposes & intent, that is to say
the said Warner L. Mennely his heirs, Executors and Assigns to keep quiet & peaceable
the whole of said property, until the said John Fry his heirs, Executors or Assigns
shall be by the said James Fox his heirs, Executors or Assigns to sell and dispose of
the same or shall be forced by public auction, first giving due public notice
of sale thereof, to sell and dispose of as much or the whole of said property

and that to the said James may require the amount of either of the said aforesaid debts singly or all together as may be required of the case; and thereupon, be the said John Fox his heirs, Executors or Assigns after death shall pay the amount of any one of the said debt aforesaid or all of them, with the Interest thereon & any other incidental expenses attending the execution of this bond and in case of any surplus of money or property that the said John Fox his heirs & Assigns as the case may shall or may ^{have} be duly restore & paid, unto the said Warner L. Marmeleby his heirs, Executors or Assigns. Nevertheless the said Warner L. Marmeleby, his heirs and Assigns may at any time previous to the sale of the aforesaid property discharge the said debt, Interest & Costs attending the same & costs of recording this Bond, which shall amount the same to all intents and purposes. In testimony whereof the said Warner L. Marmeleby, James Fox and John Fox, do severally hereunto set their hands & affix their seals the day and date of this indenture.

The Condition of this obligation is that if the above Thomas New Simon Dogges & others at the said Tobacco Warehouses in the counties of King William Henry and Queen Anne faithfully perform his duty according to the directions of the several Acts of Assembly for the inspection of Tobacco, then this obligation to be void and of no effect, otherwise it shall remain in full force and virtue.
