This Indenture made this twenty sixth day of September eighteen hundred and fifteen between John Hill Sheriff of the County King William in behalf of the Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part and Andrew L Moore of the County of said and Parish of Saint John of the other part (interpell) that whereas he the said Hill Sheriff as aforesaid did on the day of August last it being King William August Court proceed to sell eleven lots lying in King William and one lot situate charged in the Commissioners books to Alexander Kenaday of the County of _____ for delinquent taxes for the year 1793-1794-1802-1803-1804-1805-1806-1807-1809 and 1810 with interest damages and costs as aforesaid, and after duly exposing for sale, buying the said lots eight lots thereof was purchased by ^{the said} Andrew L Moore for the sum of eighteen dollars forty three and a half cents. Now therefore he the said Sheriff as aforesaid in consideration of the premises and in consideration of the said sum of eighteen dollars forty three and a half cents this day in and paid by him the said Moore the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and contented bargained and sold and by these presents doth hereby grant and sell alienable & confirm unto him the said Moore his heirs and assigns the right of the aforesaid lots, To have and to hold the said eight lots with all the tenements hereditaments and appurtenances unto him the said Andrew L Moore his heirs executors administrators and assigns to his other heirs according to an act of the assembly in such case made and provided on the tenth day of February eighteen hundred and fourteen, Given from _____ and seal this day and year above mentioned.
