Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty shillings current money in hand paid to the said Ambrose Supercorn by the said Synty and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge but more particularly for the natural love and affection which I do and lawfully do have and am beloved grand Children Synty Robert Shering and John Graham Children of Mary Graham and also for diverse other good causes hereunto me moved and confirmed and by these presents I give grant and confirm unto the said Synty Graham Robert Moore Graham Shering Graham John Graham and all the Children that the aforesaid Mary Graham was hereafter have the following property to wit. Seven Acres of Land in the Parish of Saint John and Philip's Town Parish of Saint John three lots and parcels one do is large looking glass one Mahogany stand and Kitchen furniture two boxes one Table ten and seven cuns with all the furniture of the furniture to have hold and enjoy all and singular the said property forever unto the said Synty Graham Robert Moore Graham Shering Graham John Graham and all the Children that the aforesaid Mary Graham was hereafter have to their only proper use and behoof to them and their heirs forever and the heirs and assigns of the said Ambrose Supercorn executor and administrators and all and every person or persons in lawless In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written -
