

This Indenture made the 26th day of December in the
first year of the said King William the Third and in the
first year of the said Queen Anne between Bartholomew
of the County of Kingstham of the one part and John Milt
County of the other parts Witnesseth that for and in consideration
sum of four hundred and twelve dollars and fifty cents lawful money
of the Commonwealth to the said Bartholomew Harvey in hand paid
the said John Milt at or before the making and delivery of these presents
the said Bartholomew Harvey doth hereby acknowledge
to the said Bartholomew Harvey hath granted bargained and sold and by these
presents doth give bargain and sell unto the said John Milt his
executor administrators and assigns the following Negroes Hannah Oney
Milly and Jack to have and to hold the said Negroes and their
future increase unto the said John Milt his executor administrators
and assigns forever I said always and upon condition that said Bartholomew
Harvey his executor administrators shall and do well and
lawfully cause to be paid unto the said John Milt his executor administrators
the full and just sum of four hundred and twelve dollar and
fifty cents as particularly described in a bond bearing equal date with
these presents on or before the 15 day of December next ensuing the
date hereof then and in such case these presents and the negroes hereby
granted and every sentence herein contained shall cease determine and
altogether void to all intents and purposes any thing herein contained to the
contrary notwithstanding and the said Bartholomew Harvey doth hereby
for himself his executor and administrators covenant and agree
with the said John Milt his executor administrators and assigns that
the said Bartholomew Harvey his executor or administrators
shall and well well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said
John Milt his executor administrators or assigns the said sum
of four hundred and twelve dollar and fifty cents at such time
as is herein before mentioned and further that it shall and may
be lawfull to and for the said John Milt his executor administrators
and assigns from time to time and at all times from and after
default shall happen to be made in payment of the said sum
of four hundred and twelve dollar and fifty cents or any part thereof
contrary to the form and effect of the aforesaid proviso and covenant
of the same peaceably and quietly to enter into have hold occupy possess
and enjoy the said before named negroes and their future increase
and to receive and take the profits thereof forever without any
suit trouble distress or interruption of or by the said Bartholomew
Harvey his heirs or assigns or of or by any other person or persons
whatsoever and it is hereby declared and agreed by and between
the said Parties to these presents that in the mean time and untill

and twenty dollars and fifty cents contrary to the
aforesaid promise and covenant for payment of the same it
being lawful to and for the said Bartholomew Harway and his heirs
by and quietly to have hold and enjoy all and singular the before named
negroes and their future increase to and for his and their own use and
benefit without any suit trouble or interruption, of the said John Mill his
executors administrators or assigns or of any other person, or persons lawfully
claiming or to claim from by or under him, or them or any of them in this
whereof the parties have hereto set their hands and affixed their seals

This Indenture made the first day of February One thousand eight hundred
and three between George Schell and Susanna his wife of the County of
Capitaine of the one part and Anthony Thomas of the County of King William
of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Schell and Susanna his wife
for and in consideration, of the sum, of one hundred and thirty three
pounds current money of Virginia to him the said George Schell in hand
paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained
and sold and by these presents grant bargain, and sell unto the said
Anthony Thomas a part of the tract or parcel of land which to the said
Schell purchased of the estate of Thomas Soombs deceased lying in the County
of King William aforesaid on Mallopony was containing according to a survey
made by John Fox Fifty and a half Acres and bounded as follows viz
beginning on Mallopony river at a corner near a fire and Ash Hickory to the
land of Edmund Berkeley square and reaching from thence with the land of
said Berkeley North nearly seven degrees West one hundred and thirty three
poles to a stake opposite to a cedar in the lane thence with the side of
said land North thirty eight and a half degrees east twenty and a half poles
to an Apple tree corner to the land set apart for a burying ground thence
North fifty eight degrees East more poles to a stake thence North seventy two
