

Know all men by these presents that we Benjamin Figg and John Woodley  
 held and firmly bound unto his excellency James Barbour Governor of the  
 wealth of Virginia for the time being and his successors in the sum of five  
 dollars to the payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said  
 and to his successors we bind ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators  
 and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the  
 day of June 1812. The condition of the above obligation is such that  
 the above bound Benjamin Figg is appointed Constable of the County of  
 William: If therefore the said Benjamin Figg shall well and truly well  
 due return make of all process and precepts to him directed and pay  
 all sums of money and tobacco by him received by virtue of any writ  
 to the person or persons to whom the same are due, his her or their  
 administrators or assigns, and in all other things shall truly and  
 execute and perform the said Office of Constable during the term  
 continuance therein. Then the above obligation to be void otherwise  
 remain in full force and virtue -  
 signed, sealed and acknowledged  
 in presence of The Court.
