This Indenture

made this sixth day of March in the year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred and seven, Between Charles Eigg of the County
of King William in the state of Virginia of the first part, Robert Pollard
of the same County of the second part and Beverly Robinson of the said County
of the third part Witnesseth, that the said Charles Eigg for and in consideration
of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the
said Robert Pollard and the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge, for the
further consideration of securing to the said Beverly Robinson the payment of the sum
of five pounds seven shillings and four pence like lawful money of Virginia the
grant bargain and sell and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell in
the said Robert Pollard and all that tract of land with its appurtenances
be the said Charles Eigg purchaser of Isaac Quarter lying situate being
in the parish of St. John and county aforesaid containing by estimation thirty seven
and an half acres be the same more or less, it being the same tract on which the
said Charles Eigg now resides To have and to hold the said tract of land with its
appurtenances unto the said Robert Pollard and his heirs, executors, administrators & assigns, after
trust nevertheless, and the true intent and meaning hereof is, any thing herein contained to
the contrary notwithstanding, that is to say, if the said Charles Eigg, his heirs, executors or
administrators shall on or before the sixth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand
eight hundred and twelve, pay the said Beverly Robinson his heirs, executors or assigns the
just and full sum of five pounds thirteen shillings ten pence lawful money of Virginia with
interest thereon from the date of these presents, also the further sum of five pounds thirteen
pence like money with interest thereon from the date of these presents, and also the further
sum of five pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence like money with interest from the date
of these presents, together with the costs of recording this Indenture, then this Indenture shall be
void, but if the said Charles Eigg, his heirs, executors or assigns shall refuse or fail to pay either of
the said last mentioned sums of money at the periods as they shall respectively become due
with interest as aforesaid, that then it shall be lawful for the said Robert Pollard and his
heirs, executors, administrators or assigns at the request of the said Beverly Robinson his heirs, executors
or assigns, to sell the said tract of land with its appurtenances or so much thereof as may
