This INDENTURE made this 19th day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand
and Sixty eight hundred and ten between Charles Rogers of the first part, Samuel Edwards of the second
part both of the county of King William, and Robt King, John Fox, Nathaniel Fox and Robert
Temple London & brother of John King deceased of the third part, witnesseth, that whereas
the said Charles Rogers stands indebted to the said Robert King, John Fox, Nathaniel Fox
and Robert Temple London & brothers as aforesaid, in the sum of one hundred and twenty
pounds currency by him rated the fourth day of January 1806 and payable the
day of January 1808 with Thirteen Moors yearly thereon, and whereas the said Charles
Rogers has since received no bond written from this County, and the trustees forwarded no
further security, to the said Charles Rogers for and in consideration of securing the
just payment of said bond and interest to the said trustees their heirs or executors
for the just consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid, the sum
of his full handing which is, have granted, bargained & sold and by these pre-
sent bargains, confirm and deliver unto the said Samuel Edwards the following
property to wit three slaves, Ishamom, Oney one child Luther also four hens of
one three brother Birds and furniture, upon trust for the purposes aforesaid, that
that the said Samuel Edwards after receiving the aforesaid property, may en-
trust the same to the said Charles Rogers to have the free use thereof, until he shall see cause otherwise to do
so, or until the said Charles & trustees or the acting ones of them shall require
and Samuel Edwards his heirs executors or assigns to dispose of the said prop-
erty, such requisition to be to the said Samuel Edwards his heirs, executors or assigns by
public notice to dispose of the same for ready money, he or they further
reasonable public notice of the time and place of sale, or so much thereof
be sufficient to discharge the aforesaid Bond & Interest, expense of recording
and any other incidental expenses relating to the same and case of a sufficient
property or money the sum to be restored to the said Charles Rogers or his
heirs, Nevertheless the said Charles Rogers his heirs, executors or assigns are
at any time previous to the sale of said property, to discharge the said bond
(and costs incurred in consequence of this trust deed,) which shall and may be
charge of the said property and this deed made null and void and of no use

ing by a late survey One hundred and fifty acres, bounded by the lands of William
Boswell's representatives to the west, by the land of Spotswood D Chamberlayne to the
North and East and by the land of Mourning Lipscomb to the Southwest, togeth-
er with all the advantages, privileges, emoluments, hereditaments and appurtenances what-
ever. To have and to hold the said Tract of land with the tenements, hereditaments
and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended and
any part and parcel thereof with every of their rights, members and appurtenances
unto the said Reuben Madison his heirs and assigns for ever, to and for the only
use & behoef of him the said Reuben Madison his heirs and assigns for
a full free and ample manner as the right and authority as is contained in
the Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox to convey above mentioned
