eight hundred and ten between Charles Rogers of the first part, Samuel Edwards of the second
part, both of the county of King William, and Robert King, John Fox, Nathaniel Fox and Robert
Temple executors & trustees of John King deceased of the third part, Metropeth, that when
the said Charles Rogers stands indebted to the said Robert King, John Fox, Nathaniel
and Robert Temple executors as aforesaid, in the sum of one hundred and twenty and
certain currency by to & dated the fourth day of January 1806 and payable the
day of January 1808 with Thomas Moore security thereto, and whereas the said
has since received said bond monies from this county, and the trustees aforesaid
further security, be the said Charles Rogers for and in consideration of securing the
just payment of said bond and interest to the said trustees their heirs or assigns
for the better consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt
of he both hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained & sold and by these presents
grant, bargain, confirm and deliver unto the said Samuel Edwards the following
partly to wit three slaves, to wit: One and child Ruth, also four head of
and three barrels of corn, upon trust for the purposes aforesaid, that
that the said Samuel Edwards after receiving the aforesaid property, may cause
Rogers to have the use thereof, until he shall see cause otherwise to do
and until the said Executors & trustees or the acting one of them shall require
said Samuel Edwards to his heirs, executors or assigns to dispose of the said property
such requisition, to the said Samuel Edwards, his heirs, executors or assigns, shall
by public auction to dispose of the same for ready money, he or they shall give
reasonable public notice of the time and place of sale, or so much thereof
be sufficient to discharge the aforesaid Bond & Interest, expenses of recording
and any other incidental expenses relating to the same and cost of a complete
property or money the same to be returned to the said Charles Rogers or his heirs,
heirs: Nevertheless the said Charles Rogers his heirs, executors or assigns are to pay
at any time previous to the sale of said property, to discharge the said bond
(and costs incurred in consequence of this trust deed,) which shall and may be
charge of the said property and this deed made null and void and of no use
otherwise to remain in full force. In testimony whereof the said Charles

and eleven Between Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox of the County of King William
of one part and Reuben Madison of the said County of the other part Whereas in and
in chancery in the County Court of King William between the said Reuben Madison
Plaintiff and William Dandridge Adm of Elizabeth Chamberlayne dec^d William D
Chamberlayne, Thomas D Chamberlayne, Robert Pollard Jr and Evelyn his wife, Mary
E Chamberlayne by Robert Pollard Jun^r her guardian and Spouse of D Chamberlayne
by Thomas D Chamberlayne his Guardian. Defendants, It was ordered and decreed
Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox should convey a title to the said Reuben Madison
for the land and premises in the Complamant's Bill mentioned upon his the said
Complamant paying unto the said Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox Commissions
in the decree mentioned the sum of four hundred and fifteen dollars with inter-
thereon from the first day of July 1807 till paid. Now this Indenture witnesseth
that the said Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox for and in consideration of the sum
of four hundred and fifteen dollars with interest thereon from the first day of
July 1807 till the above date of this Indenture, the receipt whereof they do hereby
acknowledge, do convey a title of the said tract of land in the Bill mentioned contain-
ing by a late survey One hundred and fifty acres, bounded by the lands of William
Boswell's representatives to the west, by the land of Spotswood D Chamberlayne to the
North and East and by the land of Mourning Lipscomb to the Southwest, together
with all the advantages, privileges, emoluments, hereditaments and appurtenances wher-
unto. To have and to hold the said Tract of land with the tenements, hereditaments
and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended and
every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights, members and appurtenances
unto the said Reuben Madison his heirs and assigns for ever, to and for the only
benefit use & behoof of him the said Reuben Madison his heirs and assigns forever
in full free and simple manner as the right and authority as or is now in
the said Bernard Lipscomb and Nathaniel Fox to convey the said land from
