The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named Tompkins hath obtained a license to keep an ordinary at Kildare, of therefore the said Tompkins doth constantly find and provide in his said Ordinary, good wholesome and dainty food and drink for travelers and strangers, Seller and provider of pasture and forage the season may require for their horses for and during the time of one year from the date of these presents, and from thence till the next Court held for the said County of King William, and shall not suffer or permit any unlawful gaming in his house, nor on his last day suffer any person to tipple and drink more than necessary then their due to be void or else to remain in full force & virtue.
