The Condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above Christopher Tompkins hath obtained a License to keep an ordinary at Hilders, if therefore the said Christopher Tompkins doth constantly find and provide in his said Ordinary, good wholesome and cleanly Lodgings and diet for travelers and Stageage, Sadler and provender or pasturage and forage as the season may require for their horses for and during the time of one year from the date of these presents, and from thence till the next Court held for the said County of King William, and shall not suffer or permit any unlawful gaming in his house, nor on any day suffer any person to tipple and drink more than necessary then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force & Virtue.
