This Indenture made this 26<sup>th</sup> day of August 1817 between Dudley Armstrong of the County of King William of the first part, Robert Pollard of the same County of the second part, & Thomas Basher and John Woody of the third part, witnesseth that the said Thomas Basher and John Woody having become bound as securities for the said Dudley Armstrong, in two stay Bonds to the sum payables to William Bowe for the sum of ninety four dollars and fifty cents, with interest thereon from the date till paid, and one to Oliver and Brand for the sum of thirty one pounds eight shillings and nine pence  $\frac{1}{2}$  p. which Stay Bonds are taken by virtue of executions from the Court of King William County, to the Sheriff of said County directed, and are payable on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November next of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia passed the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November 1772 "concerning executions and for other purposes," and to the said Dudley Armstrong being willing to secure and indemnify the said Thomas Basher and John Woody from all loss and injury in consequence of said security ship, and for the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said Robert Pollard, at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents, he the said Dudley Armstrong, hath granted, bargained and sold and these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said Robert Pollard, one negro boy named James to have and to hold the said negro boy James unto the said Robert Pollard his heirs and assigns upon trust nevertheless and the true intent and meaning hereof is that is to say if the said Dudley Armstrong his heirs and executors or administrators shall secure and indemnify and present the said Thomas and John Woody their heirs executors administrators or assigns from all loss and injury or costs in consequence of the aforesaid security ships when required by the said Thomas Basher and John Woody their heirs executors or adm't and the drawing recording and carrying this Indenture into execution, then the same to be void to all intents and purposes. But if the said Dudley Armstrong his heirs executors or adm't when required by the said Thomas Basher & John Woody their heirs executors or adm't shall refuse or fail to secure indemnify and present the said Thomas Basher & John Woody their heirs executors or adm't from all loss which they may sustain in consequence of said security ships and pay the same drawing recording and carrying this Indenture into execution that then in such case it shall & may be lawful for the said Robert Pollard his heirs executors or adm't to sell the said negro boy James at publick auction for ready money after having him for a reasonable time at some publick places in the County of King William and the money arising therefrom first to be applied to repaying or reimbursing the said Thomas Basher and John Woody their heirs executors or adm't and
