 precepts to him directed and pay and satisfy all sums of money and
 charges by him received by virtue of any such process to the persons
 persons to whom the same are due he her or their executors
 administrators in all other things shall truly and faithfully execute and
 perform the said office of constable during the term of his continu-
 ance then the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full
 force and virtue

 seals this 22nd of June 1807 -
 The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above
 Sarah Denny hath obtained a licence to keep an Ordinary at Brandywine
 in the County of King William if therefore the said Sarah Denny doth
 constantly find and provide in her said Ordinary good wholesome and
 plenty lodging and diet for travellers and stallage and provender expending
 and provender as the season shall require for their horses for and during
 the term of one year from the day of these presents and from then
 till the next Court held for the said County of King William we
 shall not suffer any unlawful gaming in her house nor on the Sabbath
 day suffer any person to tipple and drink more than is necessary
 then the obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force
