

This Indenture made the 13th day of November in the year
 our Lord eighteen hundred and seventeen between Elizabeth Nelson of the County
 of King William of the one part, and John Self of the County of Caroline of the
 other part Witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Nelson in consideration of
 real friendship to the said John Self hath this day graciously given
 him the said John Self a certain parcel or tract of Land lying partly
 in King William County and partly in Caroline which was willed to the
 Elizabeth Nelson by her deceased father William Nelson, and contains
 late survey three acres three rods and nineteen poles. Beginning
 small white oak on the west side of the road leading to John Self's
 to Elizabeth Nelsons land in the said Selfs land, running North 86th
 30 poles, thence to a large pine on the west side of the public Road
 leading from Newtown to Mangelick Church, thence down
 said Road 66th poles, thence to a red oak on the north side of the
 said road, running to James Mennard North 30th W 37 poles
 to the corner of the said James Mennard land, and to his heirs and assigns
 forever.

...and granted to me with the said self husband and myself
 that the said Elizabeth Nelson was specially as well as generally intended
 the premises above. In witness whereof she the said Elizabeth Nelson
 set her hand and affixed her seal.

The above shows the form of Three acres three rods one nineteen poles
 land lying partly in the County of King William and partly in the County
 of Stafford, and on the north side of the public road aforesaid, being
 part of the land devised to Elizabeth Nelson by her deceased father
 and now given by said Elizabeth Nelson to John Shep.
