

This Indenture made the 30<sup>th</sup> day of October 1795 between  
John and Mary his wife of the same County and parish of the other party  
that the said Frances Lambeth for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds  
hundred pence and lawful money of this date by the said William Tolson & at or before  
the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof she doth hereby acknowledge and  
thereof accept and discharge him the said William Tolson & his heirs & forever have quen  
tainer & full right and the said William Tolson & his heirs & their heirs & successors  
eternally from all claim and demand whatsoever he or they may have or hereafter  
shall have or make or incur in respect to all his or their lands or tenements or possessions  
or any part thereof or to all his or their rents and profits therefrom or of  
any part thereof or to all his or their chattels whatsoever of the said Frances Lambeth to have and to  
hold in trust to the said Christopher Johnson and conveyed unto the said William  
Tolson to hold to him his heirs and assigns forever and the said Frances Lambeth  
hereby waives and forever disposes the right title to all such lands or tenements  
etc as shall be or shall be in date above mentioned
