This Indenture made the first day of February the thirteenth eight hundred
and three between George Sobell and Susanna his wife of the County of
Capitol of the one part and Anthony Thomas of the County of King William
of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Sobell and Susanna his wife
for and in consideration, of the sum of one hundred and thirty three
pounds current money of Virginia to him the said George Sobell in hand
paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained
and sold and by these presents grant bargain, and sell unto the said
Anthony Thomas a part of the tract or parcel of land which to the said
Sobell purchased of the estate of Thomas Soome, deceased lying in the County
of King William aforesaid on Mattapony was containing according to a survey
made by John Fox fifty and a half Acres and bounded as follows Viz
beginning on Mattapony river at a corner near a fore and Aft Hickory to the
land of Edmund Berkeley aquest and running from thence with the land of
said Berkeley North sixty seven degrees East one hundred and thirty seven
pole to a stake opposite to a cedar in the lane thence with the residue of
said land North thirty eight and a half degrees East twenty and a half pole
to an Apple tree corner to the land set apart for a burying ground thence
North fifty eight degrees East one pole to a stake thence North twenty two

Spring to a stake in the ditch, then with the ditch South
degrees east twenty pole to another stake then North forty eight
East eighty eight pole to a Sycamore on the river Bank thence down
the river as it meanders One hundred and thirty pole to the beginning
together with all and singular the privileges emoluments and appurtenances
therunto belonging to have and to hold the said land and premises
lawfully conveyed and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said
Anthony Thomas his heirs and assigns forever in fee absolute and uncon-
ditional for sempre to his and their only proper use and behoof. And
the said George Sobell for himself his heirs executors and administrators
doth further covenant and agree to and with the said Anthony
Thomas his heirs and assigns that he the said George Sobell his heirs executors
and administrators the said land and premises lawfully conveyed and every
part and parcel thereof unto the said Anthony Thomas his heirs and
assigns will forever warrant and defend against the right title claim
and demand of all and every person, and persons whatsoever. In testimony

said County of King William to make Acknowledgment of the said
Indenture. Therefore we do give unto you or any two or more of you power
to receive the acknowledgment which the said Susanna shall be willing
to make of the conveyance aforesaid contained in the said Indenture
which is annexed and we do therefore command you that you do
personally go to the said Susanna and receive her acknowledgment
of the same and examine her freely and apart from her said Husband
whether she doth the same freely and voluntarily without her persuasions
and without either she or her said Husband being in any manner
compelled or otherwise that the same may be duly acknowledged
