This Indenture made this 25th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and sixteen between Gideon May and Priscilla his wife, James Denton & Mary his wife,
 William May, Dimock May, and Isaac May & Alice his wife of the one part, and Christopher Tompkins junior of the other part, whereas Dimock May, late
 of King William County, gather of the said Gideon, Mary, William, Dimock, and
 Isaac reported his life intestate, seized of a fee simple estate in a small tract or parcel
 of land containing by survey made since his death sixty acres, leaving the above
 named five distributees, and two others to wit: Thomas May and Richard May, and
 whereas the first named five ^{named} distributees have sold to the said Christopher Tompkins junior
 their several rights and interests in the said tract, piece or parcel of land, This Indenture
 witnesseth that the said Gideon May and Priscilla his wife & James Denton & Mary his wife
 William May, Dimock May, and Isaac May, and Alice his wife, for and in consideration of
 the sum of twenty eight dollars and forty eight cents to each of them the said Gideon May,
 James Denton, William May, Dimock May, and Isaac May respectively in sum paid,
 the receipt whereof they and each of them do hereby separately, and severally acknowledge
 have granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, and
 release and confirm unto the said Christopher Tompkins junior, their several
 proportions, rights and interest, in the aforementioned tract, piece or parcel of land
 surveyed by John Fox the 18th day of March 1814 and by him reported to contain sixty
 acres plainly bounded, together with all the singular the privileges, emoluments & other
 immovable lands belonging, to have and to hold the said respective proportions of land
 hereby conveyed unto the said Christopher Tompkins junior his heirs and assigns forever
 in fee absolute and unconditional fee simple to him and them only proper use and behoof
 And the said Gideon May & Priscilla his wife, James Denton & Mary his wife, William
 May, Dimock May, and Isaac May & Alice his wife doth themselves, their several
 heirs, executors and administrators further covenant and agree to and with the said Christopher
 Tompkins junior his heirs and assigns, that they the said Gideon May and Priscilla
 his wife, James Denton & Mary his wife, William May, Dimock May, and Isaac May
 and Alice his wife their several heirs executors and administrators the said respective shares
 rights and interests, in and to the said tract, piece or parcel and immovable lands
 conveyed, and all and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Christopher

Gideon May junior his heirs and assigns will by these presents warrant and forever
defend against the right, title, claim, and demands of all and every person and
persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Gideon May and Dimock May, his
wife, Amos Dabney Settler his wife, William May, Dimock May, and Isaac
May and Alice his wife do hereunto set their hands and affix their seals, the day
and date of their residence.
