We Christopher Tompkins Jr and Thomas Babney Magistrate
in and for the county aforesaid in the State of Virginia do
hereby certify that Martha Cock one of the parties to a certain
deed of conveyance of real estate to Jacob Burras, bearing
date the 26th day of February 1819, and heretofore annexed
personally appeared before us and being examined by us
privily and apart from her husband, and having the contents
aforesaid fully explained to her, the said Martha acknowledged
the same to be her act and deed and declared
that she had willingly signed, sealed and delivered the
same, and that she wished not to retract it. We do
further certify that George R. Cock party to the
aforesaid, duly acknowledged the same before us.

26th day of February 1819.
