This Indenture made the 15th day of July 1810, between Jane Hornett of the one part and William Gregory trustee for Mary Lipscomb (wife of [Signature]) and her children, Susannah, Thede Lipscomb, Mally Cole Lipscomb, Thornton Lipscomb and Austin Lipscomb of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Jane Hornett for and in consideration of the natural love and affection she bears to the said Mary Lipscomb and her children, and also for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to [Signature] Jane in hand paid by said William Gregory trustee as aforesaid, at or before the execution and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof she the said Jane doth hereby acknowledge given, granted, bargained, sold, delivered and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, sell, release and confirm unto the said William Gregory the following negroes, namely Sarah, Palmer, Sarah, Tom, Nelly and child Tom, and the future increase of the female line of Tom during her natural life) in trust nevertheless that the said William Gregory shall apply the profits arising from the said negroes to the support and maintenance of said Mary Lipscomb and children during the said Mary's natural life and at her death to the equal distribution thereof among the said Mary's children to wit Susannah Thede Lipscomb, Mally Cole Lipscomb, Thornton, Clarborne Lipscomb, and Austin Lipscomb and their heirs for ever. To have and to hold the said negroes with their future increase unto the said Gregory trustee as aforesaid (and for the use and purposes before mentioned, to the only profit and behoof of him the said William Gregory trustee to him and his heirs for ever, and the said Jane Hornett for herself and her heirs the said negroes and their future increase against the said Jane Hornett her heirs and assigns and against the claim or claims of every other person whatsoever shall and will warrant and for ever defend by these presents. Know all men by these presents that we Christopher Tompkins and Beverly Bell
 do hereby and firmly bind unto James Monroe esq. Governor of the Commonwealth
 on the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars, to which payment well and truly
 to the said Governor, or his successors, we bind ourselves, and every of us, our heirs
 heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally by these presents. Witness our hands
 this 28th day of Jan'y in the year 1811.

The Condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above bound
 Tompkins hath obtained a Licence to keep an Ordinary at Kildore in the County of
 William, if therefore the said Christopher Tompkins doth constantly find and provide
 said Ordinary good wholesome and cleanly lodging and diet for travellers and for
 and provender, or pasturage and provender as the season shall require for their horses
 the time of one year from the day of the date of these presents, and from the
 Court held for the said County of King William, and shall not suffer or permit
 full gaming in his house, nor on the sabbath day suffer any person to tipple
 necessary, then this obligation to be said otherwise to remain in full force and
