Bagwell and Ann his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five pounds twelve shillings and lawful money to be paid him part before the inventory and delivery of these presents he receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents doth fully and absolutely grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said John Mallett his heirs and assigns forever sixteen Acres of land to the same more or less beginning at a corner Aah South 22 degrees East 309 1/2 Poles to corner first Oak in Matthew Tolson's line thence to corner Pine at the head of a gully in ditch made by consent N 16 degrees E 94 1/2 Poles running to a corner in the dividing line thence 2 degrees E 7 3/4 Poles to a small corner Pine made by consent in Fox's line thence to a small side on the side of the branch William Danney's line South 60 degrees W 18 Poles thence down the Branch as it runs to the beginning to have and to hold the said granted Premises with the appurtenances and Privileges thereto belonging unto him the said John Mallett his heirs and assigns forever to be and then further as from W. the said John T. Bagwell and his wife for ever. Hereunto to be added his wife and his children and their posterity the last

The Commonwealth of Virginia to William Gray, Jas. Hill and Thos R Evans
Gentlemen Justices of the County of King William bearing witness John T. Bagwell
and Ann his wife have by their Indenture of bargain and sale bearing date the 22nd
of January 1807 sold and conveyed unto John Mallot one certain tract or parcel of land
containing by estimation sixteen Acres be the same more or less lying and being in the
County of King William and whereas the said Ann cannot conveniently travel to
our County Court of King William to make acknowledgement of the said conveyance
therefore we do give unto you or any two or more of you power to examine her freely
and take her depositions concerning the conveyance aforesaid contained in the said
Indenture which is hereto annexed and command you that you personally go to the
Ann and examine her freely and apart from the said John T. Bagwell before
examining her concerning the said Indenture and take her acknowledgement thereof
and when you have examined her soe and caused her acknowledgement that you do
in the presence of the said John T. Bagwell and others do thereupon sign and seal to this
