This Indenture made this 5<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirteen between John Garnett and Locky his wife Josephine to the use of the County of King William of one part and Peter Babor of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said John Garnett and Locky his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty dollars to him the said John Garnett in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and give all and singular unto the said Peter Babor the land and plantation wherein the said Garnett now lives except five acres which has a tract of the main certain namely nine acres more or less are bounded as follows to wit beginning in the public road leading by the Root Spring at a corner of the lands of John Bradberry, John St. Grant and Thomas Garnett the running westward 89 & 100 to a hollow opposite to the fork road, thence down that branch as they wind 33 rods to a corner on said branch, thence by a new line of 11.30 Rods to the public road near where John St. Grant's line crosses the same with his line at 6 1/2 11.13 Rods to the Dorrell swamp, thence down the swamp as it meanders 191 Rods to a Penn corner with Thomas Garnett, thence and Garnett's line of 19.6 156 Rods to the beginning, together with all and singular the franchises, emoluments and appurtenances thereto belonging: To have and to hold the said land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof to him the said Peter Babor his heirs and assigns for ever except aforesaid conditional fee simple, to his and their only daughter Mary Ann, wife of John Garnett and Locky his wife do for themselves their heirs and assigns joint and agree to and with the said Peter Babor his heirs and assigns that he and the said John Garnett and Locky his wife, their heirs and assigns shall and will furnish freely conveyed and all and every part and parcel of the same to the said Peter Babor, his heirs and assigns joint and severally upon the payment of the sum of

of King William to the said John Garnett, which is of record in the office of the Clerk of King William County, bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1810, for certain purposes therein contained as a reference hereto, will fully appear. Now the said Joseph C. Fox for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand received, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge, do hereby release and relinquish all and every pretension to said land, the intent of said conveyance being annulled by a recent and recently made otherwise, for its fulfillment, he the said Joseph C. Fox, to hereby warrant and will forever defend the right and title of said land unto the said John Garnett his heirs and assigns forever, against the claim and demand of all and every person or persons claiming under him his heirs, executors or administrators. In testimony whereof the said John Garnett and Lockey his wife Joseph C. Fox to witness at this hands have sealed the day and date of this instrument.

doth say, the 1<sup>st</sup> day of King William County Courting Whereas John Garnett and his wife Lockey have by their indenture of Bargain and sale bearing date the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1813 sold and conveyed unto Peter Baker one certain tract of Land containing by estimation justly nine acres to the said nine acres being lying in the County of King William aforesaid. And whereas the said Lockey cannot conveniently travel to our County Court of King William aforesaid to make her acknowledgment of the said conveyance. Therefore we do by our or any two or more of you power to examine her privately and to acknowledge and sign concerning the conveyance aforesaid, contained in the said indenture annexed will command you that you personally appear before us or before her privately and apart from the said John Garnett her husband concerning her executing the said indenture and take her in view therupon, and when you have examined her as aforesaid and received her acknowledgment that you distinctly and plainly certify to us thereof in our names to the Writ. To all to whom this presents shall come, I Edmund Littlepage  
of the county of King William and state of Virginia send greeting: Whereas I have  
Barnby my uncle of the City of London in the Kingdom of Great Britain, m  
shorted by his certain writing called a Power of Attorney bearing date the  
24<sup>th</sup> day of August One thousand seven hundred and ninety three signed with  
the said Barnby in his hand and sealed with his seal the which contains  
being a man of record in the County Court of Hanover in the aforesaid State of  
Virginia nominate and appoint me his true and lawful attorney  
young and to whom belonging granted unto me full power and lawful authority  
for him to do name and to his use sign on his behalf to ask, demand, sue for  
and collect in any way he or his agents or servants may receive of and from all  
and every person and persons in the British State of Virginia or else where in  
North America all and every debt due him sum or sums of money, accounts  
for goods & services rendered him effects whatsoever which at the  
time of making and entering upon his or which should or might thereafter be  
due to him by virtue of or belonging to him the said Barnby; and further to  
do & all whatever acts necessary I legal for the liquidating, and settling  
of every account or accounts as of this and effectually as if he the said Barnby  
were personally present thereby ratifying and confirming, and thereby giving  
to hold as good and valid all and whatsoever I his said attorney, or my agents  
or substitutes, might or may lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue of this  
writing. And whereas the said Edmund Barnby by his letter addressed to  
me bearing date the day of , did entitling and  
empower me to constitute, nominate, appoint and authorise me or my substitutes  
powers as substitutes for me and in my name, as attorney to demand and  
perform all and any business which I myself, might or could do in virtue of any  
of the powers and authority vested in me by the aforesaid letter, and Power of  
Attorney herein before mentioned. Now know ye that by virtue of the  
and authority given and vested in me by the writings aforesaid above  
Edmund Littlepage of the County of King William and state of Virginia  
do make, constitute and appoint my brother Edmund  
Lander County and State my true Lawyer
