

Indenture made this seventh day of March 1800 between
of the County of Kent, William of the one part and Robert Hill of the said County
of the other part Witnesses that the said John Lubbard in order to secure
payment of a debt due to one David Ward by bond amounting to the sum of
pounds ten shillings for which Edward Cary Tuck stands bound as surety and
Order to save him the said Edward C. Tuck harmless and indemnify him for
payment of the aforesaid sum of eight pounds ten shillings and for and in consideration
of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Robert Hill at or before the making
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John
Lubbard hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain
sell unto the said Robert Hill all that piece or parcel of land lying in the Town of
and leading from Aybells Warehouse to said Bridge running back and bounded by the
lands of William Powell and Thomas Rowe sons to include the quantity of fifty Acres
with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging and the reversion and
reversions remainder and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits there
of every part or parcel thereof and also all the Estate right title interest trust power
privilege and demands whosoever of him the said John Lubbard his heirs Executors ad
ministrators assigns or assigns in or out of the said lands tenements hereditaments and promises to be
made to hold the said fifty Acres ^{land} together before mentioned to be hereby granted with
them and every ~~part~~ of their advantages and appurtenances unto the said
Robert Hill his heirs Executors administrators assigns forever upon Trust Nevertheless
that the said Robert Hill shall when ever called on by the said Edward C. Tuck
at any time after the expiration of Three months from the date of these
presents paying ten day previous notice proceed to sell the aforesaid fifty acres of land with
the best bidder for the best price that can be obtained in cash and out of the money
arising from the sale to pay in the first place all reasonable charges attending the
sale and the debt before mentioned and the residue of the monies arising from such sale
as aforesaid to the use of him the said John Lubbard his heirs Executors administrators
or assigns or assigns to such persons or persons as he by writing from under his hand shall appoint in
writing whereof the parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals
the day and year above written.
