Between John Taylor & Lucy his wife of the county of Caroline, and William Taylor their son; Witnesseth the said John Taylor and Lucy his wife for and in consideration of the affection for the said William their son, and of one dollar by them in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have given granted and sold, and do hereby give, grant and sell unto the said William their son, a certain tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the fork of Pamunkey & Mattaponi Rivers purchased by the said Taylor of Carter & Fitzhugh conveyed to him by deeds recorded in the General Court confirmed by a decree of the Richmond Court of Chancery and containing there the said and twenty seven acres be the same more or less, together with all the title in law or equity of them the said John Taylor or Lucy his wife and of either of them in or to the said tract of land and every part and parcel thereof, also the thirty one negro Slaves following, Jack, Bob, Levey, Randall, Gilbert, Rachel, Ambrose, London, Melly, Phillis, Alice, Esther Jerdy, Wagoner Harry, old Sarah, Gerard, Betty, Solomon, Sharper, Reuben, Aaron, John, Sally, Orange, Paris, Phillis, Nancy, Robin, Dice, Sam and Harry now living on the said plantation; also eleven mules, fifty six head of Cattle, and all the Negro now being on the said land; and also all the tools, Carriages, utensils of every kind, and crops growing or gathered thereon. To have and to hold the said tract and parcel of land, hereby given sold and conveyed, with all and singular its appurtenances and advantages, and the said thirty one negroes with their future increase, together with all the other property before mentioned, to him the said William Taylor his heirs and assigns in fee simple, and absolute property to him and their own proper use and behoof, together with all privileges benefits and advantages thereunto belonging, and all the right in law and equity, in remembrance or omission of them the said John Taylor and Lucy his wife or either of them in or to the

and defend against the right, title, claim and demand of all and every person
