of the other part witnesseth that the said Judith White wife
Brakenbrough & Judith his wife & Mary Page White for consideration
of the sum of fifty four pounds in hand paid to
the said Philip Culanh before the sealing & delivery of this
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and signed
to be sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said
Philip Culanh a tract of land containing fifty four acres
in the parish and County above mentioned and bounded as follows
Beginning at a Black Gum in the fork of a branch running
thence up the great Spring Branch to a line bearing N.E.
near the fork of a small branch thence N.E.
to a locust tree 558 ft. from the beginning
thence S. 55 E. 167. poles to the beginning with

White William Brokensburgh & Judith his wife and Mary Page
White will well truly & sufficiently save defend keep harmless
& indemnify him the said Philip Cubank from and against
all other former & past Grants Bargains & sales Leases Acknowleg-
gments mortgages Trust Turnes for futurs & causes of futurs
Trust & causes of time lesable charges & encumbrances whatever are
the said Judith White William Brokensburgh & Judith his wife & Mary
Page White doth further covenant that they will from time to time
at all times hereafter at the reasonable request and at the cost & charge

perfect & absolute conveying & assuring the said Land and premises herein
before mentioned or intended to be hereby granted held with the
appurtenances unto the said Philip Cubank his executors & assigns
as by the said Philip Cubank his executors or assigns or his or their
widow & heirs in the law shall be lawfully and reasonably de-

This Indenture made this twenty ninth day of January in the
year of our lord and thousand eight hundred and eight
between John Lumpkin Sarah his wife of the county of King William
in the state of Virginia of the one part & George R. Smart
of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the
said John Lumpkin Sarah his wife for and in consideration
of the sum of one hundred dollars of lawfull money of
Virginia to them in hand paid by the said George R.
Smart the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge also
for encouragement of the natural love and affection that
the said Sarah has for the said George, have given ge
and bargained sold unto the said George all their right in
trust claim & demand unto to a certain tract or piece
of land lying situated & being in the parish of St. David
the county aforesaid, it being all of the tract that the
said Sarah was possessed of previous to her intermarriage with
the said John, containing by estimation eight hundred
and acres be the same more or less together
pertaining to have & hold the said tract
of land with its appurtenances unto the
R. Smart by him & agents for ever to
