sideration of twenty six pounds of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to him  
said part by the said John Buxley, at or before the sealing and deliver-  
ing these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained  
and by these presents do, and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the  
John Buxley his heirs and assigns a certain piece or parcel of land lying  
being in the county of King William containing thirteen acres and  
of an acre, bounded as follows beginning at a corner pine N 56 E 30 feet  
to a corner white Oak in Thomas Blackwells line thence S 50 E 30 feet  
a corner W. Oak, thence S 56 West 80 poles to a corner red Oak, then  
49 West 28 poles to the beginning, it being the lot 103 laid off in the division  
of Rajah Buxley's land together with all the singular houses, barns, building  
yards, gardens, orchards, lands, tenements, meadows, pastures, feedings, common and  
underwoods, ways waterways, fishing, privileges, profits, emoluments, hereditaments  
appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining, or in  
some used or enjoyed, or accepted, reputed, taken or known as part thereof
