Between Martin Sipocomb and Ann his wife of the County of Spots of the one part
and Henry J. Haughton of the County of King William, of the other part Witnesseth
that the said Martin Sipocomb and Ann his wife for and in consideration of the
sum of eight hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Henry J. Haughton
the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, and thereof acquit and discharge
the said Henry J. Haughton, his heirs, executors and assigns forever, and let the said
Martin Sipocomb and Ann his wife have granted, bargained and sold, aliened
released and confirmed, and do grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm
unto the said Henry J. Haughton, his heirs, executors and assigns a certain tract of land
situate & being devised to me by my said father, in the County of King William
& Parish of St John's, containing by a late survey one hundred and ninety three
be the same more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit: beginning at a ~~large~~ oak
small hickory corner to John Neane Esq. Mrs. Malloy and Joseph Bonds, running
down the road leading from Lainsville to Schicks mill of marked trees on the side
of the said road, between the said John Neane and Sipocomb different courses
poles to ~~an~~ hickory on the East side of the road cr. to the Kings Legation and
land, thence S 70° E 97 po to cr. L. hickory in the edge of an old field, thence
N 25° E 71 po to point of oak and spruce pine on hill side corner to
Neane small piece of land, lying on Schicks mill lands, thence between Neane
and said land, the same corner 50 po to cr. spruce pine, made by consent on

the intention of which is to convey to the said Henry T. Slaughter, his heirs or assigns forever, together with the said land and premises, together with the hereditaments and appurtenances, thereto belonging, as in any way unto the said Henry T. Slaughter, his heirs or assigns forever. And we the Sipscombs and Ann his wife, for themselves, their heirs &c. do convey the said land and premises and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto unto the said Henry T. Slaughter, his heirs or assigns forever, in fee simple, do by these presents, warrant and forever defend, the right, title, interest and demand of all and of every person or persons whatsoever.
