appertain, and the reversion and reverions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues, and profits of
the same and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the said granted premises
the negroes herein named and above named and their increase, with all and singular its ap-
pertinences, above mentioned, or intended hereby to be granted and conveyed unto the said William
Gregory his heirs and assigns for ever, and the said Bailey Fox and Sarah his wife further
and thence hence the said land, negroes and premises, and every part thereof against themselves
and their heirs and assigns all and every person and persons whatsoever, to the said William
