and at her death that part of the said land allotted to her and the benefit of such child or children as she may have living at the time of her death and their heirs forever but should the said Ann Barber depart this life without issue living at the time of her death then the part of the said land so allotted to her shall be and remain to Leonard Tunstall for and during his natural life remainder to such child or children as he may have living at the time of his death to them & their heirs forever & in failure thereof to be and remain to the right heirs of the said Ann Barber Johnson forever and it is further the true intent & meaning of these presents of the said Nicholas Johnson that the use of that part of the said land which herein before directed to be allotted to the said Ann Barber Archer Willaway shall be and remain to her during her natural life remainder to such child or children as she may have living at the time of her death to them & their heirs forever but should the said Ann Barber Archer depart this life without issue living at the time of her death then the said land so allotted to her shall be and remain to the use of Richard G. Tunstall for & during his natural life remainder to such child or children as he may have living at the time of his death to them & their heirs forever & in case of failure of the said Richard G. Tunstall to have children living at the time of his death then to be and remain to the right heirs of the said Ann B. Johnson forever. The Commonwealth of Virginia To John Rouse, Hayden Littlepage, Isaac Quinter and Mr. the Gentlemen Justices of the County of King William greeting: Whereas Nicholas Johnson and Ann his wife have by their indenture of bargain and sale bearing date the 11th day of March 1706 sold conveyed unto Thomas Blackwell, Martha Graver his wife, Richard Willaway & Ann Barber Archer a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation five hundred acres be more or less lying being in the said County and whereas the said Ann Barber Archer is now lawfully brought to our County Court of King William to make acknowledgment of the said sale therefore we do give unto you or any two or more of you power to examine her freely and her acknowledgment concerning the conveyance aforesaid contained in the said indenture which is here annexed, and we command you that you personally go to the said Ann Barber Archer to examine her freely and apart from the said Nicholas Johnson her husband touching her acknowledging the said indenture and take her acknowledgment thereupon which when recorded be as a record and receive her acknowledgment that you do so, and certify to us thereof in our next Court adjourned to the said County of King William. In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals the 11th day of March 1706.
