This Indenture made the seventh day of February One thousand eight hundred and fifteen  
between William Philip Tilghman of the first part & William T. Buckner & Richard Starling  
of the second part & James Buckner of the third parts between the said William  
Tilghman a party indebted to the aforesaid James Buckner in the sum of five hundred  
pounds as per bill executed by the said Tilghman & payable unto the said Buckner on or  
before the first day of January one thousand eight hundred & sixteen having date with the  
indenture of the said Philip Tilghman, being willing & desirous more effectually to secure the  
payment of the aforesaid sum of money with all interest that may accrue thereon to the  
time of payment, do therefore this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration  
of the sum of five hundred pounds as per bill in the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to have the said  
Philip Tilghman in hand paid by the aforesaid William T. Buckner & Starling at a time  
the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,  
the said Philip Tilghman hath granted bargained and sold over by these presents to the  
said Buckner & Starling unto the said Buckner & Starling their heirs and  
executors a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of King William which  
said tract or parcel of land was purchased by the said Tilghman from the aforesaid James  
Buckner & is known to contain three hundred & fifty acres, and the said Philip Tilghman  
doth for himself his heirs & executors and administrators warrant and for ever defend the right and  
title to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land unto them the said Buckner & Starling their heirs  
executors and assigns against the claim & demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever  
Upon trust never failing that if default shall be made by the said Tilghman his heirs executors  
& administrators in the payment of the aforesaid sum of five hundred pounds with all interest  
then may issue thence up to the time of the demand thereof by the aforesaid Buckner  
and his heirs & executors & administrators to the costs of Recording this tract and that then it shall  
be lawfully for the aforesaid Buckner and Starling their heirs executors & administrators upon  
such notice by the aforesaid Buckner to him & assigns to sell at public auction after  
having given thirty days Notice of the time and place of sale at the different public places  
within the County or by publication in some newspaper printed in the City of Richmond the whole  
sum of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land for ready money as shall be sufficient to pay the  
sum of five hundred pounds which with all interest that may accrue thereon together with the cost  
of removing and carrying into the tract and into execution and pay the same to the aforesaid  
Buckner & his heirs executors & administrators & if there be the surplus of any to pay to the  
said Tilghman or his legal representatives, then this Indenture and every thing herein contained  
to this intent may be utterly void and of no effect any thing herein contained to the  
contrary notwithstanding in witness whereof the parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed  
their seals the day & year of the foregoing.
