 Thomas Pollerton of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Richard Gwythney for and in consideration
 of the Sum of Ten pounds sixteen shillings in hand paid by the said Thomas Pollerton the receipt
 thereof by the said Richard Gwythney doth hereby acknowledge. Have granted bargained and sold
 do by these presents grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said Thomas Pollerton his heirs
 & assigns a part of the tract piece or parcel of land whereon the said Richard Gwythney now lies
 containing by survey was rated to the same was a lot & bounded as follows to wit beginning at the east
 corner of Pollerton's corner line standing on Tabney's Mill road running with said road as it were
 One pole to a red oak nearly made corner to the corner of said Gwythney's land thence by a line
 the said Gwythney's lot divided to a half pole to an elm tree thence South sixty degrees to the east
 pole to an elm Black Gum thence South five degrees East fifteen pole to a gum in a double line
 South seventy one degrees & twenty seven pole to a corner corner in Pollerton's line thence South seventy
 degrees West twenty six pole to another corner pointless thence North seventy one degrees West forty
 pole to the beginning together with all and singular the privileges, easements & appurtenances thereto
 belonging to have and to hold the said tract piece or parcel of land and premises hereby conveyed unto
 said Thomas Pollerton his heirs and assigns forever in free absolute & unconditional fee simple to
 him and his heirs and assigns and the said Richard Gwythney doth for himself his heirs
 and administrators further covenant and agree to forth the said Thomas Pollerton his heirs
 assigns that he, the said Richard Gwythney his heirs, executors and administrators the said
 and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Thomas Pollerton
 his heirs and assigns will by these presents forever warrant and defend against the right title claim
 demand of all and every person and persons whatsoever. In testimony whereof the said Richard Gwythney

made and entered into this 15th day of November in the
eight hundred and four. Between John King and Mary his wife of the County of King William
are part and Richard Dugan of the same County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
John King & Mary his wife for & in consideration of the sum of four hundred and twenty
dollars to them in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained
sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell unto the said Richard Dugan and to his heirs & assigns
forever a certain tract or parcel of land conveyed unto the said John King by Colonel Dugan
Wells his wife by and bearing date the twentieth day of August last containing by survey to be seen
herein and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at three red oak saplings corner with the land of the estate
of John Williams deceased running with that land south forty three degrees west 55 poles to
sapling corner with the land of the survey of Wells in the line of the land of the said John Williams deceased
thence north forty one degrees west thirty four poles to a red oak standing on the blony creek
near corner with the said Wells thence with said road as it runs to a hickory corner with Thomas
Neale then with the said Neale line south forty eight degrees east one hundred thirty pole to
large red oak corner with the same standing in the line of John Neale then by that oak north forty five
degrees west fifty seven poles to winter corner with the same standing in the line of the land of
said John Williams estate thence with that land north fifty five and half degrees west fifty five poles
to the beginning together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging. To have & to hold the said
premises hereby conveyed and every part & parcel thereof unto him the said Richard Dugan
& assigns forever in free absolute and unconditional fee simple to him & his only proper use
benefit and the said John King & Mary his wife for themselves their heirs & assigns further
want agree to & with the said Richard Dugan his heirs & assigns that they the said John King
Mary his wife their heirs & assigns the said land & appurtenances hereby conveyed hereby part
thereof do by these presents warrant & will forever defend unto the said Richard Dugan his heirs & assigns
against the right title & claim of all every person persons whomsoever. In witness whereof the said
John King & Mary his wife their heirs & assigns at their hands & suffered them this day & year first
in this deed written.
