 without the intervention of a court, and being anxious to effect the same do hereby
 and constitute the following gentlemen, to wit James Edwards, Madison Lipscomb
 Walter Burke referees for the purpose of laying off and dividing the said slaves
 into five equal portions in kind & value as nearly as they can, that we may
 for the same, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs, executors & assigns severally
 the sum of One thousand dollars to stand to and abide by the said division

and twelve, Between Beverly B. Lefebvre, and Polly his wife (which said
Polly is an heir and distributee of Pemberton Lefebvre late of King William
County of the one part and John Quarles of the other part, Witnesseth that
Lefebvre and Polly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifty
money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said John Quarles at or before
and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge
granted, bargained and sold (and by these presents do grant bargain and
said John Quarles all their right, title, interest claim demand and one
of an undivided tract piece or parcel of land lying and being in the
William and parish of Saint John which the said Pemberton Lefebvre
of adjoining the lands of John Smith James Lefebvre and others, which
is supposed to contain twenty five acres be the same more or less. To
the said one fifth part of the said undivided tract piece or parcel
with all and singular the hereditaments, privileges and appurtenances
in or on any case appertaining and the manner to be used
yearly and other rents, fees profits thereof and of every part
unto the said John Quarles, his heirs executors administrators
