This Indenture made this 25th day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and five between Robt Redd and Rhoda his wife, and John M^cNab all of the parish of Saint Andrew and County of King William of the one part, and John Bradbury of the same parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robt Redd Rhoda his wife and John M^cNab for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty eight dollars current money of Virginia in hand paid unto the said Robt Redd and John M^cNab the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and do by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said John Bradbury his heirs and assigns twenty two acres of land part of the tract formerly of the estate of John Parson deceased lying in the same Parish and County as aforesaid adjoining the land of the late of Elizabeth Leffewich deceased and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a corner white oak corner with said Estate of Elizabeth Leffewich deceased and running with the line of the land of that Estate South seventy two degrees and eight and a half poles to a pine sapling thence by the residue of Robt Redd's land North seven and a half degrees West eighty one pole to a red oak in John Robinsons line thence by that line North seventy two degrees East twenty two poles to a corner pine with the same, and the residue of said John M^cNab's land then by a new line South Seventy four degrees East fifty six poles to an elbow pine, thence South forty four degrees East thirty and a half pole to the beginning together with all and singular the privileges, easements and appurtenances thereto belonging to have and to hold the said land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto the said John Bradbury his heirs and assigns forever in free absolute and unconditional fee simple to his and their only proper use and behoof, and the said Robt Redd and John M^cNab for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators doth further covenant and agree to and with the said John Bradbury his heirs and assigns that they the said Robt Redd and John M^cNab their heirs Executors and administrators the said land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto the said John Bradbury his heirs and assigns will by these presents warrant and prove against the right title claim and demand of all and every person and persons whatsoever. This Indenture made the 28th day of July One thousand eight hundred and four
 between Francis Mitchell of the parish of St John's & County of King William of the one part and John White
 of the aforesaid County Parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said Francis for and in consideration of the
 sum of One hundred and fifty three pounds eleven shillings and six pence to her in hand paid by the
 John White the receipt whereof the said Francis Mitchell doth hereby acknowledge and thereof receipt and
 discharge the said John White his heirs Executors and administrators do the said Francis Mitchell both give
 bargain and sold and by their presents do grant bargain sell alien release & conform unto the said
 John White his heirs and assigns forever One half of a certain tract or parcel of land (A purchase of land
 which was left him by the will of his father James Mitchell) situate lying and being in the parish
 of St John and County of King William aforesaid containing by a late survey on the 15th day of July 1806
 hundred and thirteen acres in the same more or less & bounded as follows to wit beginning at a water
 way at the confluence of Samson White Spring branch with the Chattahoochee branch and running
 west by a nearly north line N 68 E 177 poles to a red oak sapling and passing thence
 old red oak sapling corner with the balance of that Francis Mitchell land then down the said water
