 shall well and truly execute and due return make of all process and  
 precepts to him directed and pay and satisfy all sums of money and  
 charges by him received by virtue of any such process to the persons  
 persons to whom the same are due he her or their executors  
 administrators in all other things shall truly and faithfully execute and  
 perform the said office of constable during the term of his continuance  
 then the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full  
 force and virtue

 The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above  
 Sarah Denny hath obtained a license to keep an Ordinary at Brandywine  
 in the County of King William if therefore the said Sarah Denny doth  
 constantly find and provide in her said Ordinary good wholesome and  
 plenty lodging and diet for travellers and stallage and provender  
 and provender as the season shall require for their horses for and during  
 the term of one year from the day of these presents and from then  
 till the next Court held for the said County of King William  
 shall not suffer any unlawful gaming in her house nor on the Sabbath  
 day suffer any person to tipple and drink more than is necessary  
 then the obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force

of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration  
of the sum of Twenty shillings current money in hand paid to the said Ambrose  
Sepwood before the writing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I  
do hereby acknowledge but more particularly for the natural love and affection  
which I bear and have unto my beloved grand Children Sundry Robert Moore  
and John Gresham Children of Mary Gresham and also for divers other good causes  
and considerations here given granted and confirmed and by these presents I give  
grant and confirm unto the said Sundry Gresham Robert Moore Gresham  
Sundry Gresham John Gresham and all the Children that the aforesaid Mary  
Gresham may hereafter have the following property to wit Seven Acres or more  
more or less lying in the Parish of Saint John and Philip Ten Acres or more  
more or less and further one dot or large looking glass one Mahogany stand and  
Kitchen furniture two brass one Table one and seven cens with all the fixtures  
inclosed of the farms aforesaid to have hold and enjoy all and singular the said  
property of and unto the said Sundry Gresham Robert Moore Gresham  
Sundry Gresham John Gresham and all the Children that the aforesaid Mary  
Gresham may hereafter have to their only proper use and behoof to them and  
their heirs forever and the heirs and assigns of the said Ambrose Sepwood  
in execute and administrators and all and every person or persons whatsoever

and year above written
