This INDENTURE made the fourth day of September in the year of
Lord One thousand eight hundred and ten between Eleanor Norrely of the County of
Norfolk of the first part Warner Norrely and Mariah his wife of the same County,
second part and Henry Timberlake of the County of King William of the third part, when
Ralph Norrely deceased late of the County of Middlesex aforesaid did by his last
Testament devise to his relief the said Eleanor Norrely all his Estate lying in the County
of King William aforesaid during her life and to go and descend to his son the said Warner Norrely
after her death and the said Warner Norrely having sold a part of the Land of said Estate and
said Eleanor being willing to relinquish her right therein This Indenture witnesseth that the said
Eleanor Norrely for and in consideration of the sum of Six shillings and the said Warner Norrely
and Mariah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and eighty five
dollars to them respectively in hand paid the receipts whereof they do hereby acknowledge have
bargained and sold and by these presents they do grant bargain and sell release and confirm
unto the said Henry Timberlake a part of the land of the aforementioned Estate lying in the
County of King William aforesaid containing according to a survey made by John Fox in March 1808
Sixty six acres and bounded as follows beginning at a point on a fowlers swamp near west
the Land of the Estate of William Cook deceased and running with the line of that Land N.
E. 44° S. to a large pine N. 43° E. 45° S. to a pine of middle size N. 65° E. 21° S. to a pine N. 3°
E. 89° S. to a small pine N. 5° E. 25° S. to a large pine N. 5° W. 22° S. to a pine on a west part of the
same swamp - N. 44° W. 51° S. to two black staples & a pine corner point on the line of said Cook's
Estate then with said Estate crofting fowlers swamp running partly with the Land of William
Dabney N. 60° E. 83° S. to a corner point on the line of said Henry Timberlake's land in said William
Dabney's line then with said Timberlake's Land S. 4° W. 252° S. to a point on said Timberlake's
line corner to the residue of said Warner Norrely's land as aforesaid then by a new line S. 57°
W. 134° S. to a pine in the edge of said fowlers swamp then W. 75° W. 5° S. to the beginning together
with all and singular the privileges emoluments and appurtenances thereto belonging to
have and to hold the said Land and premises hereby conveyed and all improvements
thereon unto the said Henry Timberlake his Heirs and assigns forever a full
absolute and unconditional free simple to his and their only for ever use and behoof without any
charge, Norrely and the said Warner Norrely and Mariah his wife do for themselves
and their children and descendants further warrant us agree to us with the said Henry

in all and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Henry Timbletake and his
affixes will by these presents warrant and forever defend against the claim and demands
