The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above said Sarah Drury
hath obtained a Licence to keep an Ordinary at Brandy Wine in the County of King William
of therefore the said Sarah Drury doth constantly find and provide in her said Ordinary good
wholesome and cleanly lodging and diet for travelers and stabling, fodder and provender or feed
provisioner as the same shall require for their horses during the time of one year from the
of the date of these presents, and from thence till the next Court held for the said County
King William, and shall not suffer and permit any unlawful gaming in his house on
the sabbath day suffer any person to tipple and drink more than necessary, then this

 goods & kitchen furniture, plantation Utensils and every thing belonging or appertaining
 me of whatsoever species they may be to the only use and behoof of them the said
 Christian unequal moieties to be proportioned between them or their lawful
 lives for and in consideration of the natural love and affection I bear them
 Ann and Christian also one dollar to me in hand paid at or before the
 and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and
 Thomas Anna do by these presents bind myself my heirs, Executors & Administrators
 to warrant and sign the said right and title unto the said Ann & Christian

Nancy a woman about years dark complexion, and her two children. Sally about six years old dark complexion, and her two children. Grace a woman about twenty two years about one month old both dark complexion. Clary a woman about eighteen years complexion. Torrey a man about thirty years of age, yellow complexion. And Sam a twenty five years old dark complexion, in all fifteen. The facts above stated being known we have this day delivered over said negroes unto Blackwell Foster the Attorney in fact Mary M. Cattell of King William County in the State of Virginia Administration of Samuel & Catharine, for the purpose of their being removed into the said State of Virginia they belong. Given under our hands this 30th day of April 1811.

Between Edward Cartick of the County of King William State of Virginia of the one part, and Amy Young of the County of King William State of the other part. Whereas the said Amy Young together with her husband Robert A. White do on the twelfth day of September in the year of our
