This Indenture made the twelfth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seven Between James Depew and Frances his wife of the County of King William and Parish of Saint John of the one part and Benion Slaughter of the aforesaid County and Parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Depew and Frances his wife for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred pounds current money of Virginia unto them in hand well and truly paid by the said Benion Slaughter at and before the sealing and delivery hereof the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and therewith and of every part thereof do forever acquit and discharge the said Benion Slaughter his heirs executors administrators by these presents have granted bargained sold aliened conveyed released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien convey release and confirm unto the said Benion Slaughter his heirs and assigns two hundred and forty four acres of land lying and being in the said County to the same more or less and bounded as follows Beginning in a certain swamp at the corner in the land belonging to Benion Slaughter's estate thence up the said swamp on the line of John Depew's A. untill it intersects with Robert Hill's line thence along the line of the said Robert Hill to the road leading from King William County to the Williams Ferry thence across the said road untill it intersects with the college line thence along the college line untill it intersects with the free held land belonging to the estate of Martin Slaughter dead thence along the line of the said deed to the beginning together with all and singular the rights members liberties franchises improvements hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever therunto belonging or in any wise appurtenant and the revenues and remainders rents issues and profits thereof also all the estate right title interest possession property claim and demand whosoever of them or either of them the said James Depew and Frances his wife in law equity or otherwise should have or
