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This I have done this 18th day of October 1824, between Thomas Stark and Isabella his wife of the one part and George Slaughter Junr of the other part of the County of King Williams and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said Thomas Stark and Isabella his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and fifty Dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said George Slaughter Junr, the Receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said George Slaughter Junr his heirs, executors & assigns forever, we the said Thomas Stark and Isabella his wife have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released & confirmed, and do grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm unto the said George Slaughter Jr. a certain piece of Land situated and being in the County aforesaid and containing Five acres or the same more or less, and adjoining the Land of Roger N. Lipscomb, John Willmory and said Slaughter's Land - purchases of Abner Allen; the premises, together with all the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any way appertaining unto the said George Slaughter Jr. his heirs or assigns forever. And the said Thomas Stark and Isabella his wife have conveyed the five acres of Land above mentioned and all its appurtenances unto the said George Slaughter Jr. his heirs & in fee simple, and will warrant the title to the said Land to the said George Slaughter Jr. his heirs & assigns against the the claim and demand of any person or persons whatsoever.
