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This Indenture made this 26th day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eleven, Between Walker Taliaferro and Milton Redd man of the County of King William of the one part, and James H. Leftwich of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of \$112 pounds Virginia currency to him the said Walker Taliaferro in hand paid, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained, sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, release and confirm unto the said James H. Leftwich Eighty acres of land taken from the upper part of the said Taliaferro land called Courtes lying in the County aforesaid and bounded as follows beginning in the public road called the ridge road, at a corner with William Taylor land and Thomas Redd's line, and running from thence with the said Redd's line 56 1/2 E 185 Poles to a newly made corner white Oak with the residue of the said Taliaferro's land standing in the line of the lands of the estate of William Jones deceased and running from thence by a new line S 79° W. by Poles to an old

and appurtenances thereto belonging. To have and to hold the same land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said James H. Leffewich his heirs and assigns for ever in fee simple unconditional for himself to his and their only proper use and behoof. And Walker Taliaferro do further covenant and agree for himself his heirs, assigns and with the said James H. Leffewich his heirs and assigns that the Walker Taliaferro his heirs, executors and administrators the said land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said James H. Leffewich his heirs and assigns will by these presents warrant and for ever against the right, title, claim and demand of all and every person and persons to recover. In testimony whereof the said Walker Taliaferro and Mildred Taliaferro his wife do hereunto set their hands and affix their Seals the day and date of the Indenture.

Whereas Walker Taliaferro and Mildred his wife, have by their Indenture of bargain and sale dated the 26th day of January 1811, sold and conveyed unto James H. Leffewich a tract or parcel of land containing by estimation 80 Acres be the same lying and being in the County of King William. And whereas the said Mildred C. cannot conveniently travel to our County Court of King William for acknowledgment of the said conveyance. Therefore we do give unto you or any of you power to examine her privately and take her acknowledgment and conveyance aforesaid contained in the said Indenture which is hereto annexed and command you, that you personally go to the said Mildred C. and examine her privately and apart from the said Walker, her husband concerning the said indenture, and take her acknowledgment thereupon. And you examined her as aforesaid and received her acknowledgment that you plainly certify to us thereof in our said Court annexed to this.
