

This Indenture made this 13. day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, Between Walter Saliaferro, and Mildred C. Saliaferro wife of said Walter Saliaferro of the one part, and Christopher W. Saliaferro of the other part both of King William County, Witnesseth that the said Walter Saliaferro and Mildred C. Saliaferro his wife for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and eighty dollars to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and confine unto the said Christopher W. Saliaferro a tract or parcel of land comprised to contain, by a late survey of Thomas Sabney on the 23rd of March 1816 one hundred and twelve acres, be the same more or less, and bounded as follows, beginning at a small persimmon tree, running N 48° E 6 poles to a small red oak sapling near an old mill house, thence N 36° E 33 1/2 poles to a white oak on the eastern side of the mill swamp, thence N 43° E 16 2/3 poles to a white oak on same side same swamp, thence N 33° E 23 1/2 poles to a white oak on same side same swamp, thence N 37° E 17 1/2 poles to a pine on same side same swamp, thence S 49° W 16 poles to a white oak on same side same swamp, thence N 38° 37' 46 2/7 E 100' 22 poles to a corner point in Elizabeth Wilson's land, & a spruce & white birch and 1 maple on same side same swamp, thence due south 116 4/3 poles to an apple tree, thence to New Market, thence S 24° W 84 2/3 poles to a white oak corner to New Market in the line belonging to the estate of John Page (deed), thence S 87° W 109 1/2 poles to the intersection of the line with John Saliaferro's line, thence N 50° W 11 25' 3/5 poles to a hickory, elbow in John Saliaferro's line, thence N 58° 34' W 22 poles to a small white oak elbow in John Saliaferro's line, thence N 43° W 10 4/3 poles to a stake near drawbar, corner in John Saliaferro's line, and thence N 36° 37' 46 2/7 poles to a place mentioned; small persimmon, together with all and singular the privileges, emoluments, and appurtenances thereto belonging to have and to hold the said land and premises, hereby conveyed; and all and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Christopher W. Saliaferro his and assigns forever in free absolute and unconditional fee simple, to his and only proper use and behoof. And the said Walter Saliaferro and Mildred C. Saliaferro his wife do for themselves their heirs executors and administrators, further covenant and agree to and with the said Christopher W. Saliaferro, his heirs and assigns, that they the said Walter Saliaferro and Mildred C. Saliaferro his and their heirs executors and administrators, the said land and premises hereby conveyed and all and every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Christopher W. Saliaferro his heirs and assigns will by these presents warrant and forever defend against the right, title, claim and demand of all and every person and

W. Tollesford his wife do bear unto all their hands joint with the day
this instrument.
