 Wilson & Pemberton of the County of King William and parish of Saint
 John's for the natural love and affection which I have and do bear for and
 towards my daughter Judith C. Thornton now of the City of Richmond, and
 for other good causes and considerations, and for the further consideration of
 her } One dollar to me in hand paid by Thomas Pemberton and Wilson & Pemberton
 1817 } I have given, granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do grant
 bargain and sell make over & confirm unto the said Thomas & Wilson C.
 Pemberton & as Trustees for the said Judith C. Thornton for the purposes
 hereafter mentioned, three negroes to wit: Calley, Coffin, & Skinner, and the
 future increase of the female; also two beds and furniture, that is to say
 the said Thomas and Wilson C. Pemberton Junr. shall from time to time make
 over & convey to the said Judith C. Thornton the profits arising from the
 said slaves to and for the separate maintenance of the said Judith C. Thornton,
 and at the death of the said Judith C. Thornton, then the said Thomas, and
 Wilson C. Pemberton Junr., shall convey the said slaves and their increase &
 beds and furniture in fee simple to the children of the said Judith C. Thornt-
 on & and the said Thomas Pemberton & Wilson C. Pemberton Junr. for themselves their heirs
 &c. by these presents agree to execute the trust reposed in them - In witness whereof
 the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands & affixed their seals the
 27th day of July one thousand eight hundred & sixteen -
