

This Indenture made this twenty fifth day of May Eighteenth
and twenty, between William Birch of the one part and George Dabney
of King William County of the other part, Witnesseth that whereas the
said William Birch being in the custody of the said Sheriff by virtue of
a writ of *sequestrum*, which issued from the Clerk's Office of the Sup-
reme Court of law for the County aforesaid, in the name of Robert Christian and
Ephigene of Reuben Birch, for the sum of One hundred and six dollars
and forty three cents, with after lent interest thereon from the 13th day of
August 1819 till paid and costs; And as the said William Birch having
this invited himself of the benefit of the act provided for insolvents and
given in a Schedule, in which schedule he gives up, "All his interest
in a piece or parcel of land lying in the County of King William, and
 Parish of St John, adjoining the lands of Robert and William Hill, which
lands he purchased of Reuben Birch guardian of Washington St Birch (as
Per this agreement filed in the said schedule) containing six acres
(and a half acres, more or less) and all his interest in a tract of land
which was owned by his grandfather William Carney, lying in the County
of Kent, in the possession of Peter Waddell, adjoining the lands of
Nathaniel Camp, Saml. L. Davis and Jesse S. Powers, containing Twenty
six acres more or less" Now this Indenture witnesseth that I the
said William Birch as an insolvent Debtor, according to law doth hereby
give, grant, alien, enfeoff and confirm to the said George Dabney Sheriff as
aforesaid all right, title and interest, which I the William Birch
have in and to the said two tracts of land before described, to him, his
heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I the said William Birch

within written.
