rency to him in hand paid, at or before the sealing and delivery of
this present, the receipt whereof is hereby Acknowledged, and for the further
consideration of Six shillings, the receipt whereof is also hereby Acknowledged,
he hath granted bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain
and sell unto the said Littlepage, all that tract or parcel of Land
lying and being in the County of King William containing by survey forty
Acres by the same more or less, bounded by the lands of Benjamin
Qualls, James Ruffin, Alfred Smith and the land of the said Littlepage
adjoining to Choke mill and being a part of the tract formerly owned by
David Pannell and which was divided to Edg. P. Chamberlayne and by his
Sav. who intermixed with myself bound one of the boundaries of the said David
Folhard and to hold the said tract or parcel of land to him the said Little-

hundred and Nine, Between Samuel Gauley of the County of King William in the State of Virginia
of the One part and Wiley Rose of the County of King St Queen in the said State of the
other part witnesseth, that the said Samuel for and in consideration of the sum of One
dollar of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Wiley Rose, the
receipt whereof be the said Samuel to his selfe acknowledge, and for the further consid-
eration of securing to the said Wiley the payment of thirty two pounds two shillings and
pence with lawful interest thereon from the thirteenth day of December in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two for which the said Samuel on
the day and year last mentioned made, executed and delivered his rough bill to the said
Wiley, and also for securing to the said Wiley the payment of the further sum
of Nineteen pounds eleven shillings and three pence with lawful interest thereon
from the twenty seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and four
for which the said Samuel the day and year last mentioned made, execu-
ted and delivered his bill penal to the said Wiley, he the said Samuel hath granted his service
and all that by those presents grant to him and will unto the said Wiley the following
namely, to Wil. Phil. Saml. Dan'l. Wiley, Robin, Pollard, Maria and the
said Wiley his future increase of the said family. To have and to hold the said Negro to
them with their future increase unto the said Wiley his heirs & others admo'ng his
descendents always and ever during his life and to the end of his natural life
if the said Samuel his heirs & others admo'ns or executors do and shall will and truly pay
or cause to be paid unto the said Wiley his heirs & others admo'ns or executors the sum of
thirty two pounds two shillings and six pence with lawful interest thereon from the thirteenth
day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two and the
further sum of Nineteen pounds eleven shillings and three pence with lawful interest
thereon from the twenty seventh day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and four, together with the costs of drawing recording and the expenses
of this due and execution, that when and from thenceforth they provide and every thing
harm contained shall now, then and hereafter be paid. And the said Samuel for him
self his heirs and executors doth conveit and grant to and unto the said Wiley his
heirs, executors and executors doth agree, that he the said Samuel, his heirs & others admo'
ns or executors shall and will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Wiley
his heirs, executors admo'ns or executors the said several sums of money with the interest
thereon, together with the costs of drawing, recording and conveying of this Indenture
to them or as that he the said Wiley his heirs & others admo'ns or executors may
