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KNOW all men by these presents that I William Drabney of the County of King William  
and State of Virginia by virtue of an instrument interwinded between the 3<sup>rd</sup> Elliott of the  
aforesaid County and State do by these presents constitute and appoint Thomas Johnson  
of the County of King William and State aforesaid my lawfull attorney for me and my  
name to bargaine sell and convey to whom soever he may think proper a certain tract or  
parcel of land lying and being on the banks of Rappahannock River which may be known by the  
following description. To wit containing by estimation four hundred and fifteen acres being  
the said tract of land which was granted by patent bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of October  
Seventeen hundred and four unto John Beekly a son of Seth Beekly and on the  
16<sup>th</sup> day of September Seventeen hundred and ninety three was conveyed by the said  
Beekly to Francis Graves and on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April seventeen hundred and ninety  
seven by the said Graves conveyed to Thomas Drabney and on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April Eighty  
hundred and five by the said Drabney conveyed in Trust to Thomas Elliott and by the said  
Elliott on the fourth of September following conveyed unto me and in my name to ask sue  
and sue for and receive payment for the same with sufficient power to me all lawfull  
means and ways for the recovery thereof and acquittance and other discharges for  
and in my name to make seal and deliver and to deall other lawfull acts and things  
in the premises that I myself might do were I present and also authorizing  
him to make one or more attorneys in his stead and at his pleasure to revoke him  
by ratifying and confirming all that he may lawfully do or cause to be done by

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This indenture made this twenty second day of October in the year of our Lord one  
and eight hundred and five, Between Charles Madison, Thomas P. Chamberlayne and the  
Chamberlayne his wife, of the County of King William and Parish of Saint John of the  
part and Caroline Custos of the County and parish as aforesaid of the other part, witness  
that the said Pamela Madison, Thomas P. Chamberlayne & Elizabeth Chamberlayne his  
wife an in consideration of the sum of Three pounds Current money of Virginia to them in  
paid by her the said Caroline Custos the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and  
hereby freely acquit remane and discharge her the said Caroline Custos her said late and  
very dear of them, for ever by these presents have bargained and sold to her and by these presents  
are hys off and confirm unto the said Caroline Custos her certain Tract or parcel of Land  
lying and being in the County and Parish aforesaid by estimation containing One acre he  
more a rood, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a holly standing on east side of the road  
leads over Mrs Chamberlayne's Mill thence running a south east course by a line of marked trees  
divides the said Land from Boyd Chamberlayne deceased tract of land to an ash standing by  
of a branch thence up said branch to a hickory standing near said branch thence running a  
West course to a pine standing on the side of the road from thence down said road to the  
place it began to holly and to hold the above one acre of Land, and every part or piece  
together with all the rights members privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging a way in  
pertaining unto the said Caroline Custos her heirs and assigns to the only proper use and be  
of her the said Caroline Custos her heirs and assigns for ever and the said Pamela Madison,  
Thomas P. Chamberlayne and Elizabeth Chamberlayne his wife doth covenant to and will with the  
Caroline Custos her heirs and assigns by these presents that the said Caroline Custos her he  
shall and may according to the true intent and meaning of this bond, that she and they  
and may at all times hereafter peaceably and quietly hold and enjoy the said granted Land  
provided further all former sales left mortgagees rights of dower among other encum  
berances and also the said Pamela Madison and him the said Thomas P. Chamberlayne  
Elizabeth his wife shall and will warrant and forever defend the said bargained  
and promised unto the appurtenances therof unto the said Caroline Custos her  
assigns forever. In witness against all other persons or persons whatsoever that shall  
any claim thereto, and further that the said Pamela Madison, Thomas P. Chamberlayne and  
Chamberlayne his wife and their Heirs shall and will at any time make any just  
recompence that may be thought necessary in settling about with the said Pamela
