 of the latter to him in hand paid by the said Isaac Dabney and Robert Ballard for the
 the purchase and delivery of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by
 said WILLIAM WYATT hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents hath granted
 bargain and sold unto the said Isaac Dabney Robert Ballard all that piece or tract
 tract of Land which he the said Wyatt purchased of said Isaac Dabney containing
 hundred and thirty nine and two third acres situate lying and being in the
 of St David County of King William the description of which will more fully
 appear from a deed executed by the said Isaac Dabney & Hannah his wife to
 said Wyatt bearing date the day of 1805 and recorded in the County
 of King William reference being thereunto had and the reversion and reversions
 remainder & remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and of
 every part & parcel thereof and also all the estate right title interest trust property claim
 & demand whatsoever both at law and in equity of him the said WILLIAM WYATT in
 or out of the said land tenements hereditaments & premises To have and to hold
 the said tract of land herein before mentioned or intended to be hereby granted
 with of every of its appurtenances unto the said Isaac Dabney Robert Ballard and
