Cabell Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of two thousand and fifty dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said H. Cabell or his successors or their assigns and every of us our and every of our heirs Executors and assigns jointly and severally by these presents do hereby set our hands and seals this 28th day of April 1800

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound for Pemberton hath obtained a licence to keep an ordinary at his home in the County of King William of therefore the said Wilson & Pemberton doth constantly feed and furnish in his said ordinary good wholesome and stoutry lodging and diet for travellers and strangers and for other and remainder or pastorage and provisions as the reason shall require for the same for and during the term of one year from the day of the date of these presents and thereafter for the next best part for the said County of King William and for the County of Stafford any and every day during the term of the said year
