Doct: KNOWN, that, on the 5th day of October in the year 1803, WE the
 underwritten Commissioners met at the dwelling house of Thomas Pollard in King
 George County, and, pursuant to the annexed order of the Court of the said County, proceed-
 ed to examine and settle the within account stated by the said Thomas Pollard as exec-
 cutors of Major John Pollard deceased; and upon such examination and a view of
 the vouchers produced by the said Thomas to support said account, are of opinion
 that the same is correctly stated, and established by sufficient vouchers, according
 to the nature of the cases to which they severally relate: But as several items in the ac-
 count are founded on cases of an unusual nature, although the vouchers to support
 them are deemed sufficient according to the nature of each case, yet we have thought
 proper to state such cases specially for the information and judgment of the Court.
 That is to say — On examination of said account in the article of family expenses paid
 for the estate while kept together, an item appears for "Cash paid James D Dick-
 man for sundry necessary articles furnished his Account and receipt" — On a view
 of the account in this case, disbursements appear to have been made by the executor for
 sundry necessities for the use of the white family of the testator, which, on examination
 of the law on this subject seem not to be strictly authorized by it. But it appearing
 to us that the family of the testator was left, at the time of his death, in an unpro-
 d^ec^t situation — and that the estate was required by law to be kept together until
 the end of the year in which the testator died; so that individual members of the fa-
 mily, being deprived of the use and profits of the estate during that time, in conse-
 quence of the same being exclusively appropriated to the benefit of the executor as
 agent, we have deemed it a reasonable construction of the law that the white fam-
 ily of the testator should be supported out of the profits of the estate while kept in
 that situation, as well as his slaves who are expressly provided for by law — and
 have consequently allowed such disbursements — On the articles of Clerks and
 Attorneys fees paid for the estate, several payments appear from the vouchers to
 have been made on account of fees incurred by the executor in the defense of certain
 suits prosecuted against him by the legatees of William Smith and Richard Pollard
 deceased whose representative the said Thomas testator was, the propriety of charging
 which fees paid to his said testator's estate appear at first view doubtful inasmuch
 as the disbursements having been made on account of those respective estates ought to
 be reimbursed out of the same — yet, on consideration that the suits in question are
 brought by legatees claiming an account and payment of their proportions of
 the several estates to which they are respectively intitled — and from the informa-
 tion which we have received will recover something in each case, and — if so — will also
 recover their costs of the said Thomas, and consequently he the said Thomas can-
 not recover his own costs of them or have a deduction of them from the amount

of the recovery against him - and the defence of such suit by which the costs, in
question were incurred by the said Thomas appearing to us to be proper and for the be-
nefit of his testators estate inasmuch as the same tended to prevent a larger recovery ac-
-gainst the said estate than what should be proved to be just, we have been induced
to allow the disbursements on those accounts also, all which however is respectfully sub-
-mitted to the Court of King George county, by whose authority we have been appointed, and
have acted in this case. I have set my hands on the day and year first above
