 my last will and Testament in manner and form follow-
 ing: I m^o p^o I bequeath my soule to God who gave it, firm-
 ly believing to be saved by his alone merits and fuller assist-
 of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ: and my body to be buried
 in the earth from whence it was taken, and for what ought
 Ily God's blessed will sent me I dispose of as followeth.
 To be done at the discretion of my Exe^{rs} here say I bequeath
 I leave I give and bequeath my now dwelling plantation and land
 containing one hundred & forty acres of Land to my son Daniel
 and his heirs for ever and in case my son should die without
 issue then the said plantation and land to fall to my Daugh-
 ter Elizabeth and her heirs for ever. and the rest of my
 Land which is one hundred acres more I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Elizabeth and her heirs for ever. and in case of
 her death without issue the said hundred acres of Land to fall
 to my son Daniel and his heirs for ever.
 I leave I give to my Daughter and his wife named Abigail, with
 all her personal estate and furniture for ever, I leave I give my
 pistols and jewels to my son, and for the rest of my personal
 estate I give to be equally divided between my three
 living wife and children: I leave I Ordain my beloved wife
 Martha, and my Loving Brother, Walter Smith to be
 Exe^{rs} to this my last will and Testament: as witness my hand
 this 8th of Decem^r 1672 in the year of our Lord 1690
